This list of safety warnings has been prepared based on the requirements of the General Product Safety Regulation (EU) 2023/988 (GPSR). The aim is to protect users from potential risks associated with improper use. The warnings have been written in simple and understandable language to be accessible to a wide audience, including the elderly and people with reduced mobility.

Warnings regarding the safe use of products cover the following categories of goods: Swimming pools, pool vacuum cleaners (robots), accessories, pool covers, reels, sand and filter cartridges, water attractions, aquatic exercise equipment and devices for people with disabilities and other similar products.

1. General safety requirements

Age restrictions:

Use is permitted for persons over 16 years of age under adult supervision or for adults (> 18 years) without special training. Assembly and servicing of more complex devices (pools, pool vacuum cleaners, winders) may only be performed by persons over 18 years of age with basic skills (reading instructions, using tools). Children under 16 years of age may not use the devices without constant adult supervision. Animals and persons under the influence of alcohol or drugs should not be near the devices during operation.

• **For all devices:** Read the instruction manual for the appropriate equipment before using it.

Personal protective equipment (PPE):

- Gloves: Household gloves (latex or rubber) for working with sand, filter cartridges or accessories; highly mechanically resistant gloves (fabric) for assembling pools and winders.
- Safety glasses: Simple safety glasses (compliant with EN 166) when installing sand/liners or assembling swimming pools – protection against dust and fine particles.
- Clothing: Comfortable clothing, no loose items (scarves, long sleeves) to avoid snagging on moving parts (robots, training devices).
- Footwear: Footwear with non-slip rubber soles suitable for working around a pool or on wet surfaces.

Technical condition check:

Before use, check the integrity of the products: no cracks, tears (pools, covers), damage to cables (pool robots), signs of wear (accessories, training equipment). Check the presence of instructions and completeness of the set (all elements in place). Do not use damaged products - in case of doubt, contact the seller for a replacement.

Prohibitions:

It is prohibited to leave devices unattended while working (robots, training equipment), use them during a storm (especially pools with electronics) and exceed the permissible load (e.g. >100 kg on pool covers or training equipment).

2. Storage

Storage conditions:

- Temperature: 5-35°C (avoid freezing below 0°C for pools and covers and overheating above 40°C – for robot electronics).
- Humidity: <80% to prevent mold (coverings, sand) or corrosion (metal accessories).
- Room: Dry, protected from sunlight (UV radiation destroys plastic and fabrics), dust and sharp objects (risk of puncture).

Insulation:

- o Pools, covers, coils: store coiled on pallets or racks, avoiding crushing.
- Pool robots, training equipment: in covers or boxes, away from water and chemicals.
- o Sand, filter inserts: in sealed bags/packages, away from moisture.
- Accessories, water attractions: in containers to avoid losing small items.

Access:

Store out of the reach of children and animals (e.g. at a height of > 1 m or in locked cabinets).

3. Installation and use

Preparing for work:

- Read the instructions: dimensions, weight, assembly order (pools, reels), charging (robots), compatibility (filter cartridges).
- Prepare the place: level surface without stones/sharp objects (for pools and covers), access to an electrical outlet (for robots and training equipment).
- Check safety: remove unnecessary items, ensure free access (especially in the case of devices for disabled people).

Installation:

Pools:

Be sure to read the instruction manual.

Place the pool on a flat surface (slope <2%), use a base (pool mat).
Attach the frame according to the diagram, do not overtighten the screws (risk of deformation).

Pool works:

 Charge the battery (usually 4-6 hours), connect the telescopic tube/hose, immerse in water and turn on the device. Do not run the robot outside of water (risk of overheating).

Accessories, covers, coilers:

 Installation according to instructions (e.g. cover – evenly on the pool, winder – attached to the shore). Check the tension of the cover (no more than 5% of the length).

Sand/filter inserts:

 Pour sand (fraction 0.4-0.8 mm, according to the filter volume) or insert the insert into the filter, avoiding dusting (use safety glasses).

Water attractions, training equipment:

 Assemble according to the diagram, secure (e.g. anchors for training equipment), check stability (load up to 120 kg).

Use:

- Use as intended: do not overload equipment (e.g. one person on training equipment), do not leave children unattended in the pool.
- Regularly check the water quality (pH 7.2-7.6; chlorine 0.5-1.5 mg/l) when using accessories or sand filtration.

4. Maintenance

Weekly check:

- Check for damage (torns on covers, cracks in pools), cleanliness (robot filters, filter cartridges).
- Monitor the operation of devices (robots charge status, training equipment – stability).

Monthly maintenance:

- Clean: pools with a soft sponge, robots by rinsing the filter, coverings with water without the use of chemicals.
- Lubricate moving parts (rollers, training equipment) with silicone grease.

• Seasonal maintenance (wintering/spring start-up):

- Winter: drain water from pools, dry covers, store robots and training equipment in a warm place (>5°C).
- Spring: rinse produce, charge batteries, check integrity of equipment.

5. Procedure in emergency situations

• Rupture/Puncture:

 Pools, coverings: repair using a repair kit (liquid PVC), in case of extensive damage – replace the product.

Robot failure:

 Turn off the device, check the filter/cable and restart. In case of serious failure - contact service.

Trauma:

 Fall/impact (training equipment, swimming pools): provide first aid (cold compress, antiseptic), consult a doctor if necessary.

Drowning:

Immediately pull the person out of the water, call an ambulance (103/112),
start cardiopulmonary resuscitation if breathing has stopped.

6. Disposal

Products:

- Plastic (pools, covers, accessories): recycle (PVC, PE).
- Electronics (robots): dispose of as electronic waste (WEEE) at special collection points.
- Sand: dispose of as construction waste, filter inserts recycle (PP).
- Packaging: Cardboard for waste paper, polyethylene for plastic recycling.
- **Prohibitions:** Do not throw away large items into municipal waste (fines may be imposed for violating environmental protection regulations).

7. Final recommendations

- **Consultation:** Check the compatibility of products (filter cartridges with filters, robots with pools) with the seller.
- Documentation: Keep records of installation and cleaning for warranty purposes.
- Quality: Avoid products without certificates (CE). Low quality products may break or fail.

• **Training:** Before first use, read the instructions or videos (especially for robots and training equipment).

The importance of following recommendations

Following the above warnings minimizes the risk of injury, equipment damage and financial loss. Ignoring the recommendations can lead to serious health and property hazards. Take care of your safety and the safety of your loved ones by following the precautions given.
